

SEEK GOD FIRST: Reject the lie that anything or anyone else can satisfy you.

"But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you. So do not worry about tomorrow; for tomorrow will care for itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own." – Matthew 6:33-34

SPEAK FAITHFULLY: Love others with godly wisdom, boldness, and kindness as a faithful completer of others.

"Open your mouth for the mute, for the rights of all the unfortunate. Open your mouth, judge righteously, and defend the rights of the afflicted and needy" – Proverbs 31:8-9

SHOW TRUE BEAUTY: Bodies deteriorate, persons develop. Invest in that which lasts.
